

**As a Result of our meeting:**

We identified the need to push more PSA messages to the public to remind and encourage continued compliance with stay at home 2.0, masks, ppe, and Hygiene,

We identified the need to have the community health nurse offer testing from her office to hopefully provide testing to those who otherwise would not go to the hospital to be tested (a request to her office has been sent).

We identified that the regular testing that is being performed in the hospital of hospital staff is not being counted toward our testing efforts,

We identified that currently a large number of our positive cases are from within the state run facility caliente youth center and the Transportation bus to Tonopah Test Range and family members to those workers.

Moving forward we plan to push out several PSA messages in an effort to remind the public to take precaution and assist in an effort to not overwhelm our hospital capacity. Currently we have 2 patients hospitalized with covid and all other positives are at home recovering.

We are not seeing alot of testing by asymptomatic patients and therefore our ratio between positive and negative cases is high. people don't seem to want to be tested unless they are sick.

We are doing a good job of contact tracing, the county businesses are being responsive to the rise in positive cases and several of the businesses have self-closed and are requiring a negative test result of employees prior to reopening. In general the community is aware and doing what they can to minimize spread. The hospital is currently able to meet the demand of testing and positive cases but could become overwhelmed very quickly, we will continue to push regular messaging to the public, our county offices have been meeting compliance of the commissioners request for masks and limiting contact with the public.
