**Board of Health set to discuss vaccination requirements for  
the protection of vulnerable populations**

Carson City, NV — A State Board of Health meeting has been scheduled for 9 a.m., September 10, to review COVID-19 vaccination requirements for Nevada Department of Health and Human Services and Nevada Department of Corrections employees working in certain programs.

If accepted, State staff and contracted employees working with vulnerable populations in licensed health care facilities, state correctional centers or state facilities for the detention of children, will be required to be fully vaccinated to maintain employment.

On Aug. 5, Governor Steve Sisolak announced that he requested his Medical Advisory Team (MAT) review vaccination for several specific groups. Following their review, the MAT recommended that Nevada should require vaccination for those who work with vulnerable populations.

Specific timelines related to when proof of vaccination will be required will be part of the discussion.
