# COVID-19 TREATMENT

## What treatments are available?

The U.S Food and Drug Administration has issued authorization for use of monoclonal antibody treatment and oral anti-viral pills manufactured by Pfizer and Merck.

## Where can I get treatment?

Treatment is only available with prescription from a healthcare provider or pharmacist. Treatment site locations can vary from clinics, doctor's office and other healthcare facilities. Visit the NVHR website ([nvhealthresponse.nv.gov](https://nvhealthresponse.nv.gov)) for treatment sites near you.

## Am I eligible for treatment?

Treatments are recommended for individuals that are 12 years and older, high-risk, have a confirmed positive COVID-19 test and are within five to ten days of diagnosis. Eligibility and timelines may differ based on the method of treatment available.

## Who is at risk for severe illness?

## When should I get treatment?

It is best to seek treatment as early as possible. Treatment is most effective within five to ten days of diagnosis. If you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, speak to your doctor to get treatment.
